PARENT PAYMENT FORMS / CSEF FUNDING

Camps Sports & Excursions Fund (CSEF) is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities. If you hold a means tested concession card eg. A Health Care Card, you may be eligible for CSEF funding. The amount per child is \$125 and can be used to help pay for part of the school fees or school camp.
